8 MS. HALTIGAN: Mr. Allmann?

9 MR. ALLMANN: Present.

11 MR. ALLMANN: Excused absence.

12 MS. HALTIGAN: Mrs. Clayton?

13 MRS. CLAYTON: Here.

21 MR. ALLMANN: At this time we'll proceed with
22 the rate hearing.

23 MR. HEIRING: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I
24 would like to call Mr. James Diaz to be sworn,
25 please.

1 (Whereupon James Diaz, Assistant Executive
2 Director/Director of Finance, was sworn.)

3 MR. HEIRING: Please state your name for
4 the record.

5 MR. DIAZ: James Diaz.

6 MR. HEIRING: What is your position?

7 MR. DIAZ: I'm the Assistant Executive
8 Director/Director of Finance for the Jackson
9 Township MUA.

10 MR. HEIRING: In front of you are Exhibits
11 1, 2 and 3. Do you have those?

12 MR. DIAZ: Yes, I do.

13 MR. HEIRING: These are the publications,
14 the first one is the Asbury Park Press; is that
15 correct?

16 MR. DIAZ: That is correct.

17 MR. HEIRING: We will enter that into the
18 record afterwards. And number two is.

19 MR. DIAZ: The advertisement in the Star
20 Ledger.

21 MR. HEIRING: And just for identification
22 purposes at this point what is the third one?

23 MR. DIAZ: The notification of the rates
24 that were advertised.

25 MR. HEIRING: Okay. We'll start with as

1 far as the rates go, the water rates, would you
2 like to address those first or the sewer?
3 Which is more convenient for you?

4 MR. DIAZ: If I may, I will start with the
5 connection fees, the Schedule of water and
6 sewer connection fees.

7 MR. HEIRING: Right. Okay, good.

8 MR. DIAZ: To understand how this happens,
9 the Authority prepares its schedule of rates in
10 accordance with statute and the connection fees
11 are in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:14B-22,
12 that's for both water and sewer.

13 Beginning with the connection fees, there's a
14 calculation that is conducted that first we
15 determine the gallons per day as a basis. And for
16 2019 the calculation shows 188 gallons per day is
17 the new amount. That's a change from 2018 of 207
18 gallons per day, which is a decrease of 19 gallons
19 per day. As far as the water connection, this
20 evening we are proposing for 2019 water connection
21 fee of \$4111.00. That is a \$131.00 increase from
22 the 2018 rate of \$3980.00.

23 With regard to the sewer connection fees this
24 evening, we're proposing a \$1748.00 connection fee
25 for 2019 which is a \$98.00 increase from the 2018

1 fee of \$1650.00.

2 MR. HARPELL: And Jim, how we calculate
3 those is a straight mathematical formula from
4 the system.

5 MR. DIAZ: Yes, it is. It's based on
6 capital investments as of year ending 2017.
7 And that is in conjunction with the formula
8 itself.

9 Continuing on with the Schedule of Quarterly
10 Water and Sanitary Sewer Charges, beginning with the
11 Water Service Charges.

12 The authority is proposing a 2019 rate for a
13 5/8" meter of \$35.00, which is a \$2.00 increase from
14 the 2018 rate of \$33.00.

15 For meters sizes 3/4" to 8", there will be no
16 change in the quarterly service fee.

17 Moving on to Residential and Commercial Water
18 Consumption Charges, beginning with the first tier,
19 1 to 10,000 gallons 2019 at \$2.30 per thousand,
20 compared to 2018 \$2.20, an increase of .10 cents.

21 From 10,001 to 25,000 gallons, 2019 rate is
22 proposed at \$3.50 compared to 2018 at \$3.35, a .15
23 cent increase per thousand.

24 From 25,001 to 75,000 gallons, the proposed
25 rate for 2019 is \$4.50 per thousand compared to

1 2018, \$4.35, a .15 cent increase.

2 And for 75,001 plus gallons, the proposed rate
3 is \$6.00 per thousand compared to the 2018 rate of
4 \$5.90, a .10 cent increase.

5 Continuing on to the Residential and Commercial
6 Sanitary Sewer Service Charges. Beginning with the
7 quarterly service charge the proposed rate is \$30.00
8 per quarter compared to the 2018 rate of \$28.00, an
9 increase of \$2.00. For disposal fees, up to
10 100,000 gallons, a proposed rate of \$5.20 per
11 thousand from the 2018 rate of \$5.10, a .10 cent
12 increase.

13 For 100,001 gallons plus, there will be no
14 change to that tier.

15 As far as the remainder of the schedule of
16 rates proposed this evening, there will be no change
17 compared to 2018.

18 MR. HEIRING: Okay. In regard to, you
19 were in charge basically of preparing this
20 budget; is that correct?

21 MR. DIAZ: Yes, I am.

22 MR. HEIRING: Is it your opinion that
23 these rates and fees will be able to support
24 the budget that has been prepared?

25 MR. DIAZ: Yes, they will.

1 MR. HEIRING: I think you've already said
2 this, but to sum up, the connection fees
3 basically you followed the statutory formula in
4 coming up with those rates?

5 MR. DIAZ: I did.

6 MR. HEIRING: Okay. Thank you.
7 Mr. Chairman, you can open it to see if there's
8 any questions from the public or any questions
9 from the Board.

10 MR. ALLMANN: Any questions from the
11 Board?

12 MRS. CLAYTON: No.

13 MRS. GLORY: No.

14 MR. ALLMANN: Public?

15 (No questions from the Board or public.)

16 MR. ALLMANN: Okay. Seeing none, that
17 will conclude the rate hearing.
